What are the strengths and weaknesses of development and critical theories with regard to Indigenous peoples? The talk will conclude by suggesting that in order to move forward in a balanced manner it is necessary to deconstruct—decolonize—the various layers that comprise us as individuals and communities within and outside academia.
